Mr. Ebbert Lindsay "Pat" Beck, 74, of Mount Airy, died Monday, Jan. 31, at his home.

He was the husband of Ellen Louse Hiteshew Beck.

Born Feb. 16, 1925, in Mount Airy, he was a son of the late Herman S. Sr. and Laura Marie Lindsay Beck.

He was a member of Calvary United Methodist Church, Mount Airy, American Legion Gold Star Post 191, and Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 10076.

He served as a sergeant in the U.S. Army from 1943-1946 during World War II in the European and Pacific theaters.

Mr. Beck was a self-employed farmer at Beck's Poultry Farm in Mount Airy. He was a lifelong farmer, had boated on the Chesapeake Bay and was a Baltimore Colts fan. He also enjoyed model railroading and was an avid golfer.

Surviving in addition to his wife are three sons, Ronald L. Beck of Ijamsville, David L. Beck of Mount Airy, and Ebbert Lewis Beck of Westminster; one daughter, Ellen Beck Martz of Monrovia; one brother, Charles Beck of Mount Airy; one sister, Clara Baile Harris of Fontana, Calif.; and four grandchildren, Stacey Sisler and Maggie Shabe, both of Frederick, and Lindsay Beck and Richard Martz, both of Mount Airy.

Mr. Beck was preceded in death by one brother, Herman Samuel Beck Jr.
